Student Arrival & Dismissal It is very important that students arrive to school on time, so that they can enter the school with their classmates and follow the handwashing procedures.

Our warning bell rings at 8:20 a.m. in the morning. To reduce congestion of people on our playground, we ask that parents/guardians drop off their children at the sidewalk, and that students arrive as close to 8:20 a.m. as possible. If students arrive prior to the warning bell, they are to report to their classroom meeting spot.

Our health and safety plan asked that parents/guardians stay off the school grounds when dropping off their children. This reduces physical contact and allows us to follow the health and safety guidelines. Parents of K/1 parents may wait by the yellow-lined drop-off area to support their children if needed.

At the end of the day students are to walk to parents/guardians who are picking up or immediately walk/bike ride home.

Character Counts - Character Trait for November: Citizenship

Although a big focus at Carson Elementary is kindness, we also value all positive character traits. Last year we introduced a new character trait every month to showcase and encourage a variety of positive character traits. This year we will be using the pillars of character from the program, "Character Counts". During the month of November, our focus is on citizenship.

There is, perhaps, no more important time to be a good citizen than during a global pandemic. Each of us plays a critical role in contributing to the health and well-being of others. All of us have an important role to play in maintaining the health and safety of everyone, and contributing to a positive educational environment.

One of the tools we will be sharing and introducing to our students is the Work Towards Being A Leader tool. This tool serves two important purposes. First, it defines what each role – detractor, participant, and leader – looks like in action. Good citizens are able to change detractor behaviors to participant behaviors, and participant behaviors to leader behaviors. We may not be a leader all of the time, but we can always be working toward showing expectations of a leader. This tool is also an excellent reflection tool, as students can evaluate and ask themselves, "Were my actions that of a leader, detractor, or participant, and what do I need to do better or differently tomorrow to be a better citizen?"




District Lunch Program

If you answered "YES" to one of the questions included under 'Key Symptoms of Illness' (excluding fever), you should stay home for 24 hours from when the symptom started. If the symptom improves, you may return to school when you feel well enough. If the symptom persists or worsens, seek a health assessment.

If you answered "YES" to two or more of the questions included under 'Symptoms of Illness' or you have a fever, seek a health assessment. A health assessment includes calling 8-1-1, or a primary care provider like a physician or nurse practitioner. If a health assessment is required, you should not return to school until COVID-19 has been excluded and your symptoms have improved.

When a COVID-19 test is recommended by the health assessment:

- If the COVID-19 test is **positive**, you should stay home until you are told by public health to end selfisolation. In most cases this is 10 days after the onset of symptoms. Public health will contact everyone with a positive test.
- If the COVID-19 test is negative, you can return to school once symptoms have improved and you
 feel well enough. Symptoms of common respiratory illnesses can persist for a week or more. Retesting is not needed unless you develop a new illness.
- If a COVID-19 test is recommended but is not done because you choose not to have the test, or you do
 not seek a health assessment when recommended, and your symptoms are not related to a previously
 diagnosed health condition, you should stay home from school until 10 days after the onset of
 symptoms, and then you may return if you are feeling well enough.

If a COVID-19 test is not recommended by the health assessment, you can return to school when symptoms improve and you feel well enough. Testing may not be recommended if the assessment determines that the symptoms are due to another cause (i.e. not COVID-19).

If you answered "YES" to questions 2 or 3, use the <u>COVID-19 Self-Assessment Tool</u> to determine if you should seek testing for COVID-19.

A health-care provider note (i.e. a doctor's note) should not be required to confirm the health status of any individual.


